

Reserve Cheat Sheet

AT away from the HTC

- Minimum of 2 IPPs reported.
- Monthly BAS is automatically credited.
- Start Field Rations checkage the day they go into field duty status.
- Stop Field Rations checkage the day they come out of field duty.
- The command must report the DMR checkage for any period where meals are provided (MCTFSPRIUM table 8-1)
- NOTE: IF MARINE IS PROVIDED MEALS THEN GOES DIRECTLY INTO A PERIOD OF FIELD DUTY DO NOT REPORT DMR THEN CHECK FIELD RATIONS (THIS WILL HAVE TOO MANY 25% DAYS), INSTEAD REPORT DMR CHECKAGE OR CHECK FIELD RATIONS FOR THE ENTIRE PERIOD IN WHICH MEALS WERE PROVIDED.
- Field rations checkage is reported after the final IPP is reported (check in one block). Do not report during first IPP (Marine will be overpaid 75% on two days in the middle).
- Married Marines are entitled to BAH II with dependents for the entire AT period.
- Prior to 9 Apr 04, single E-4s with 4 years service and above are entitled to BAH II O/R on last day of AT. Effective 9 Apr 04, ALL single reserve Marines are entitled to BAH II own right on the last day of AT.
- NOTE: BAH ACCRUES FOR ANY DAY GOVERNMENT LODGING NOT PROVIDED.

Home site AT

- Minimum of 2 IPPs reported
- Monthly BAS is automatically credited
- If HTC is entitled to RIKNA the Marines would receive Monthly BAS for the first and last days and need to have BAS RIKNA credited for the days in between.
- The command must report the DMR checkage for any period where meals are provided (MCTFSPRIUM table 8-1).
- Married Marines are entitled to BAH II with dependent for entire period.
- Single Marines are entitled to BAH II O/R if government quarters are not provided.

ADSW

- If for 30 days or less, must report IPPs.
- First and last days Marines are entitled to BAS Monthly.
- If HTC gets RIKNA, Marine's are entitled to RIKNA for days in between.
- If the orders are for 139 days or less, the Marine is entitled to BAH II.
- If the orders are for 140 days or more, the Marine is entitled to BAH I at duty station zip code.
